Objectives of the action	<p>Overall objective</p> <p>The overall objective of the project is to generate empirical evidence, based on country/sub-regional and product case studies, regarding the benefits that African members of the ACP Group can obtain from enhanced multilateral Geographical Indication (GI) protection as a basis for the African Group to engage in the Doha negotiations on the establishment of the multilateral register for wines and spirits and the proposed extension of protection to products other than wines and spirits under Article 23 of TRIPS.</p> <p>Specific objectives</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide evidence and arguments for African ACP countries to support additional protection for GIs for products other than wines and spirits
Purposes of the action	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Organise a 2-day conference in Geneva, Switzerland in December 2010. The event is expected to gather participants from line Ministries, officials from regional integration organisations, private sector representatives and relevant representatives from the civil society; • The results of the study undertaken by experts referred to in section 2.1. are presented and discussed by the participants.

Preparation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Drafting the detailed agenda of the event in close coordination with the experts in charge of the study; ✓ Identify, contact and ensure the commitment of keynote speakers and moderators; ✓ Draft and print a concept paper presenting the conference; ✓ Compile the list of invitees; ✓ Draft and send invitations in the name of the beneficiary; ✓ Recruit key note speakers and moderators; ✓ Draft a brochure to be dispatched during the conference including success stories; ✓ Ensure the logistics (venue, accommodation, booths, ushers, catering, transportation, etc.). <p>2.
